## Peter Anderson, PhD Candidate Department of Geography and Planning, Queen's University

The Central Experimental Farm is the third oldest continuously operated agricultural research station in the world. Established in 1886, the early days of the Farm were characterized by a diversity of experiments across every agricultural field from cereals through horticulture, poultry, and chemistry. Alongside the famous Marquis wheat, scientists at the Farm developed hardy apples for the Prairies and sought new markets for Canadian produce in Ireland and Scotland. Many of these experiments anticipated the research still underway at the Farm today. In this seminar, Peter will share some of the stories he's uncovered during his research on the historical and cultural geography of the Farm in relation to the city, the country, and wider international partnerships.
